Structure Governance and Management

Constitution

The Charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (a SCIO). It was registered in its current legal form on 28th May 2014. The charity was previously an unincorporated association but changed its legal form to a SCIO. The assets of the unincorporated association were transferred to the SCIO on the 28th May 2014. It has a single tier structure and as such the trustees are the members of the charity.

Appointment of trustees

An individual, nominated individual or body can apply to become a trustee of New Team. Any applications will be considered by the Trustees, and acceptance is wholly at their discretion.

The maximum number of trustees is thirteen. The minimum number of trustees is three.

Objectives and Activities

Charitable purposes

The organisation is founded on Christian principles. The organisation is established for charitable purposes only, and in particular, the objects are:

The advancement of citizenship or development of community, in particular:

- a. Making relationships with young people who have few positive relationships and avenues for support and help them realise their full potential.
- b. Identifying the needs and interests of young people and develop appropriate strategies for action, either by New Team or with other agencies.
- c. Working with young people towards their personal, social, and spiritual development and to encourage young people to take more control over their lives, in line with youth work principles.
- d. Helping bridge gaps in understanding between the local community and young people.
- e. Signposting adults to organisations and services in a way that aids their empowerment as parents, carers and members of a supportive community for young people.
- f. Undertaking research into new ways of working with marginalised young people and their communities.
- g. Developing new expressions of church, with those young people and community members who are interested.
- h. Supporting projects with similar objectives both locally and globally.

Activities

New Team activities were street youth work (detached work). Fundraising activities included speaking in a couple of churches, grant applications and promotion through social media. This year the detached work relationships were developed with a view to expanding youth work in 2016-17.

Achievements and Performance

The main type of detached work undertaken was building relationships. This began with a soft approach of saying hi or smiling. Then young people started asking who we were and why we were there. From there relationships were gradually developed, especially with the 12-14 year olds, who are mainly male. Detached workers built trust and became known as people the young people could go to for help. This is the foundation for developing further youth work in 2016-17, especially taking those we work with most closely on trips to further develop relationships. The increase in trust also allowed some conversations to happen around health related topics such as smoking and energy drinks. As relationships deepen there will be more opportunities to respond to young people's personal, social and spiritual needs in a variety of ways.

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TRUSTEES REPORT (continued)
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Volunteers were recruited for a variety of roles, including for youth work, phone support, prayer and food and fellowship roles. Louise McMorris started 73.6 hours/month invoiced work for New Team performing management, admin and youth work tasks. Several policies and structures were developed. 10% of unrestricted income was also raised to support another project in line with the above charitable purposes and subsequently allocated equally between New Destiny in Brazil and the Pakistan School for Christian Children.

Financial Review

The trustees are grateful for the support of individual donors, the Peter Vardy Foundation, the Govan Church of the Nazarene, and an anonymous Trust for their support of the charity's work. During the period all expenditure was on charitable activities.

Reserves Policy

The unrestricted funds represent income donated but not yet utilised in supporting charitable activities. At 28 February 2016 the charity held £6,051 at the bank and the Trustees consider this to be appropriate to allow them to manage the charity's operations.
