#### Structure Governance and Management

#### Constitution

The Charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (a SCIO). It was registered in its current legal form on 28<sup>th</sup> May 2014. The charity was previously an unincorporated association but changed its legal form to a SCIO. The assets of the unincorporated association were transferred to the SCIO on the 28<sup>th</sup> May 2014. It has a single tier structure and as such the trustees are the members of the charity.

#### Appointment of trustees

An individual, nominated individual or body can apply to become a trustee of New Team. Any applications will be considered by the Trustees, and acceptance is wholly at their discretion.

The maximum number of trustees is thirteen. The minimum number of trustees is three.

#### Objectives and Activities

#### Charitable purposes

The organisation is founded on Christian principles. The organisation is established for charitable purposes only, and in particular, the objects are:

The advancement of citizenship or development of community, in particular:

- a. Making relationships with young people who have few positive relationships and avenues for support and help them realise their full potential.
- Identifying the needs and interests of young people and develop appropriate strategies for action, either by New Team or with other agencies.
- c. Working with young people towards their personal, social, and spiritual development and to encourage young people to take more control over their lives, in line with youth work principles.
- Helping bridge gaps in understanding between the local community and young people.
- e. Signposting adults to organisations and services in a way that aids their empowerment as parents, carers and members of a supportive community for young people.
- f. Undertaking research into new ways of working with marginalised young people and their communities.
- g. Developing new expressions of church, with those young people and community members who are interested.
- h. Supporting projects with similar objectives both locally and globally.

#### Activities

New Team activities were street youth work (detached work and trips). Fundraising activities included grant applications and promotion through social media. This year the detached work relationships were developed further through trips with a view to expanding youth work further in 2017-18.

#### **Achievements and Performance**

The main type of detached work undertaken was developing relationships. Then trips were used to deepen these relationships, with a view to developing further youth work in future, e.g. small group work, mentoring and social action. There were opportunities to positively influence young people through conversations on the street and during trips. The trips and most of the detached work relationships were with young men, due to the day and time that detached work took place. We were especially aware of the positive influence male youth work volunteers were able to have on some of the young men. Some young people asked more questions about faith, God and church too. As relationships deepen there will be more opportunities to respond to young people's personal, social and spiritual needs in a variety of ways.

Volunteers were recruited for a variety of roles, including for youth work, phone support, website design, newsletter, prayer and food and fellowship roles. Louise McMorris continued 73.6 hours/month invoiced work for New Team performing management, admin and youth work tasks. 10% of unrestricted income was also raised to support another project in line with the above charitable purposes. This will be allocated at the trustees meeting on 4/10/17 and information about the outcome of this decision will be circulated to supporters via social media.

#### **Financial Review**

The trustees are grateful for the support of individual donors, and an anonymous Trust for their support of the charity's work. During the period all expenditure was on charitable activities.

#### **Reserves Policy**

The unrestricted funds represent income donated but not yet utilised in supporting charitable activities. At 28 February 2017 the charity held £6,241 at the bank and the Trustees consider this to be appropriate to allow them to manage the charity's operations.
