Status of Charity and Governing Document

New Team SCIO was registered as a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation on 28 May 2014. The charity registration number is SC044882. The charity was previously registered as an unincorporated association. It has a single tier structure and as such the trustees are the members of the charity.

Trustees and Office Bearers

Management of the charity remains with the trustees. The day to day management of the operational work of the charity is undertaken by the Trustees' and delegated to Louise McMorris, the Project Leader.

Appointment of Charity Trustees

An individual, nominated individual or body can apply to become a trustee of New Team. Any applications will be considered by the Trustees, and acceptance is wholly at their discretion. The maximum number of trustees is thirteen and the minimum number is three.

Objectives and Activities

Charitable Purposes

The organisation is founded on Christian principles. The organisation is established for charitable purposes only, and in particular, the objects are:

The advancement of citizenship or development of community, in particular:

- a. Making relationships with young people who have few positive relationships and avenues for support and help them realise their full potential.
- b. Identifying the needs and interests of young people and develop appropriate strategies for action, either by New Team or with other agencies.
- c. Working with young people towards their personal, social, and spiritual development and to encourage young people to take more control over their lives, in line with youth work principles.
- d. Helping bridge gaps in understanding between the local community and young people.

Charitable Purposes (contd.)

- e. Signposting adults to organisations and services in a way that aids their empowerment as parents, carers and members of a supportive community for young people.
- f. Undertaking research into new ways of working with marginalised young people and their communities.
- g. Developing new expressions of church, with those young people and community members who are interested.
- h. Supporting projects with similar objectives both locally and globally.

Activities

New Team activities were street youth work (detached work) and youth work trips. Fundraising activities included grant applications and promotion through social media.

Achievements and performance

During the summer and into the autumn of 2018 we raised funds to employ a part-time youth worker (young men) in December 2018. This was because it was hard to find youth work volunteers in this season: The trustees decided employing a second youth worker would lead to more stability for the youth work. Fundraising also began for an office and youth work space and the transformation of this space. Detached youth work restarted in January 2018 after a training period for the new youth worker while we waited for his PVG update to come through. It was quiet on the streets through the winter months but we were able to re-establish contact with some young people. In this period (10/1/19 - 28/2/19) we had 12 detached youth work sessions. We made plans to launch detached work sessions in a second area of Govan from March 2019. Enough funds were raised to look for a building to lease in 2019/20. While 2018/19 was a year of transitions, this has prepared the way for the youth work to expand in 2019/20 into a second area, with new groups of young people, to make leasing a building possible and to reconnect with some young people. We were then able to take a couple of these young people on trips early in March 2019. This season also allowed us to refresh policies and take part in training.

Financial review

The trustees are grateful for the financial support of individual donors, The Anchor Foundation, Allchurches Trust Ltd, The J & C Fleming Charitable Trust, the Bellahouston Bequest Fund, Dr Guthrie's Association and an anonymous Trust. The trustees would also like to thank all volunteers for the donation of their time. During the period all expenditure was on charitable activities.

Results for the year

The financial statements for the year are set out on pages 5 to 8. The Receipts and Payments Account on page 5 reflects a surplus for the year of £13,957 (2018: £1,197). Of this amount, £8,440 is being carried forward to next year as restricted money given in advance.

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds at a level which equates to approximately three months unrestricted expenditure. This allows sufficient funds to enable the ongoing work of the charity to be maintained. The General Fund on page 6 at 28 February 2019 amounted to £14,398 (2018: £8,881), which is above the required level.

Total reserves, including restricted funds, amounted to £22,838 (2018: £8,881).

Report of the Independent Examiner to the Trustees for the year ended 28 February 2019

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 28 February 2019 which are set out on pages 5 to 8.
